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
DISMANTLING

THE DIGITAL DIVIDE

The world is dramatically changing before our eyes. The World Bank estimates that globally 10 billion United States Dollars in lifetime earnings could be lost by virtue of this interruption. At the height of the pandemic, 1.6 billion children were affected by school closures. Locally, all schools were closed in Liberia. While many have functioning devices and stable electricity, unfortunately, the majority of Liberians can only dream about this kind of access. We envision a day when our fellows and administrators have the means to deliver instruction in virtual formats in the event of any interruption, possess tools to assist in measuring student progress, and have the ability to share reports regarding updates in their respective teaching communities.

Teach For Liberia has launched an ambitious campaign to raise funds for 100 laptop computers equipped with antivirus software, a computer case, and a charging device for those driving our organization's mission forward. Local vendors who are able to provide packages with the aforementioned items at \$1,000 USD per computer have already been identified. As a result of having this technology, our fellows will be able to do even more for our students and their communities. The gap between rich and poor students has been exacerbated worldwide, but with your partnership, we can narrow that divide and improve the situation for those that are as passionate about education as we are!

Purchases a LAPTOP with antivirus software, Microsoft Office suite, and a water-resistant case




Each fellow receives a laptop allowing them to both teach and learn themselves without interruption

NATION BUILDER'S MINDSET LECTURE SERIES






SEASON OF MILESTONES

Teach For Liberia was registered as an NGO in 2012 and has since been working towards addressing the educational inequity that undermines our education sector. We are happy that over the last several years we have cultivated our relationship with the Ministry of Education and signed an MOU in July 2019. Our first Fellows were placed shortly thereafter. On the heels of these successful placements in Bomi and Montserrado, we were thrilled to join the Teach For All network on September 24th, 2019. Amidst a challenging and dynamic year with COVID-19, we are happy to celebrate our support of 70+ fellows and a growing team of 11 full time employees.

We have had countless thought partnership sessions with our Teach For All partners and our work and stories have been featured in various forms of media. This work has ranged from our Emergency Feeding Program to our partnership with Profuturo on training 1800+ teachers.
